



"The Crown Jewel of Prophets"

Isaiah is known as the crown jewel of Old Testament prophets, it is the book that strikes awe in the heart of its reader. The words of Isaiah were often found on the lips of the Christ, the Messiah prophesied in Isaiah. Think then, if Jesus, God incarnate, honored this grand and glorious book so highly, how we ought to do the same. In its 66 chapters lies the destiny of nations, the future of all mankind . . . includes yours and mine, Beloved. Is it any wonder Isaiah is mentioned by name 54 times in the Bible

including all the Gospels, Acts, and Romans? Isaiah is called "**The Book of Salvation.**" The name Isaiah means "**The Salvation Of The Lord**" or "**The Lord Is Salvation.**" Isaiah, who is called the Prince of Prophets, shines above all the other writers and prophets of Scripture. His mastery of the language, his rich and vast vocabulary, and his poetic skill has earned him the title, "**Shakespeare of the Bible.**" He was educated, distinguished, and privileged, yet remained a deeply spiritual man. Isaiah's calling as a prophet was primarily to the nation of Judah (the southern kingdom) and to Jerusalem, urging the people to repent from their sins and return to God. He also foretold the coming of the Messiah and the salvation of the Lord. Many of his prophecies predicted events that occurred in Isaiah's near future, yet at the same time they foretold the events of the distant future (such as the coming of the Messiah), and even some events still to come in the last days (such as The Second Coming Of Christ).

"Jesus Christ, The Most Important Theme"

Almost one-third of the chapters of the book of Isaiah contain prophecies about Jesus Christ, addressing both His First and Second comings. Isaiah provides more prophecy of the Second Coming of Christ than any other Old Testament prophet. The following are some prophecies about Christ in both His first and second comings: "**He shall judge between the nations**" (Isaiah 2:4). He was to be the "**Branch of the Lord**" (Isaiah 4:2; Isaiah 11:1). He would be born of a virgin and be called "**Immanuel**" (Isaiah 7:14; Isaiah 8:8, 10). He would be a "**Stone of stumbling and a rock of offense**" (Isaiah 8:14). An eternal "**Government will be upon His shoulder**" and He would be called the "**Prince of Peace**" (Isaiah 9:6-7). The Holy Spirit would "**Rest upon Him**" (Isaiah 11:2). He would be "**A tried Stone, a precious cornerstone, a sure foundation**" (Isaiah 28:16). Christ is directly spoken of in more than half of the chapters between Isaiah 40 and Isaiah 61. Undoubtedly, the most important chapter pertaining to mankind's salvation is Isaiah 53. This prophecy explains how much He would suffer during His sacrifice for man's sins. **Isaiah was truly a Prophet of God!**

"The Prophetic Books Are God's Roadmaps"

Down through history, God provided us a roadmap. He foretold various signs and conditions through His prophets. These prophets spoke of things that mankind should watch for so that the Messiah would be recognized and believed. These signs or prophecies were given to us in the Old Testament. The Old Testament is the part of the Bible written before Jesus was born. Its writings were completed in 450 B.C. The Old Testament, written hundreds of years before Jesus' birth, contains over 300 prophecies that Jesus fulfilled through His life, death and resurrection. The prophets of God were often sent on dangerous missions. The prophets were to warn the people about God's coming judgment against sin. They were sent to call the people back to God in repentance and to assure them of God's continuing love and purpose for them.

"Prophetic Books Pointed The Way To Jesus"

Biblical prophets pointed the way to Jesus, the Messiah, and showed humans their need of His salvation. A true prophet was called and equipped by God, empowered by the Holy Spirit to perform his job—to speak God's message, confront people with sin, warn of coming judgment and the consequences if God's people refused to repent and obey. As "Seers," prophets also brought a message of hope and future blessing for those who walked in obedience.

"The Difference Between Major and Minor Prophets"

The Prophetic Books are divided between the Major and Minor Prophets. The terms "**Major**" and "**Minor**" are meant to describe their length and the importance of their message. To put it simply, God chose to disclose more through the Major Prophets than through the Minor Prophets. One-third of the Bible is prophecy—history written in advance. God gives us prophecy as a proof, not as a scoresheet.

"What Are The Odds?"

Mathematically speaking, the odds of anyone fulfilling this amount of prophecy are staggering. Mathematicians put it this way: 1 person fulfilling 8 prophecies: 1 in 100,000,000,000,000,000 1 person fulfilling 48 prophecies: 1 chance in 10 to the 157th power 1 person fulfilling 300 plus. It is the magnificent detail of these prophecies that mark the Bible as the inspired Word of God. Only God could foreknow and accomplish all that was written about the Christ. This historical accuracy and reliability sets the Bible apart from any other book or record. In terms of historical reliability, the Bible is superior to any other ancient writings. This is the miraculous and reliable record of the Word of God. God gave us these prophecies to build our faith and point the way to His Son. As John 1:1-3 states: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through Him all things were made; without Him nothing was made that has been made."
